



E-Act Blackley e-Safety Rules

Dear Parent,

The Internet is an extremely rich resource both for learning and for recreation.

We will encourage children to make effective use of the rich information resources available on the Internet both for study and for recreation. We will encourage children to develop the appropriate skills and understandings that will enable them to use these resources well and safely, as well as the ability to analyse and evaluate the resources they find. These skills will be fundamental in the society our pupils will be entering. Children will be encouraged to make use of both the Internet and e-mail.

Our Internet access is through Manchester Education Wide Area Network, and within the school network we use a filtering system that restricts access to sites containing inappropriate content. All our screens are in public view and normally an adult is present to supervise.

No system is perfect, however, and you should be aware that it is not possible to remove entirely the risk of finding unsuitable material. We ask both pupils and parents/carers to sign the form to show that the e-Safety rules have been understood and agreed. A full copy of the e-safety policy is available on request.



Think then Click

	<p>We can click on the buttons or links when we know what they do.</p>	
	<p>We can search the Internet with an adult.</p>	
	<p>We always ask if we get lost on the Internet.</p>	
	<p>We can send and open emails together.</p>	
	<p>We can write polite and friendly emails to people that we know.</p>	

Key Stage 2

<p>e-Safety Rules for Key Stage 2</p>	
<p>We ask permission before using the Internet.</p>	
<p>We only use websites that an adult has chosen.</p>	
<p>We tell an adult if we see anything we are uncomfortable with.</p>	
<p>We immediately close any webpage we not sure about.</p>	
<p>We only e-mail people an adult has approved.</p>	
<p>We send e-mails that are polite and friendly.</p>	
<p>We never give out personal information or passwords.</p>	
<p>We never arrange to meet anyone we don't know.</p>	
<p>We do not open e-mails sent by anyone we don't know.</p>	
<p>We do not use Internet chat rooms.</p>
